Bus Transportation

- Students are assigned to their bus based upon the address. If the student's address changes, it is important to notify the office of the change. To change an address at the school, the parent/guardian must bring two current (within 30 days) proofs of address.
- Students who are automatically enrolled in the school or who enroll during the summer will be assigned a bus route and mailed information about the bus number and bus stop before the school year begins.
- Students who enroll during the school year will have to wait two or three school days to be assigned to a bus.
- Students may not get on busses they are not assigned to.
- Students are expected to be at their bus stop at least 10 minutes before the designated time.
- If for some reason, the assigned bus does not come, students should wait for a substitute bus.



- The EBR school system provides bus transportation for all students. Bus riding arrangements are managed by the Transportation Department of EBRPSS and may be reached at (225) 226-3784, 6013 Choctaw Drive. Permission will not be granted for students to ride any bus other than the one to which they have been assigned.
- Safety is the priority for our bus drivers. Riding the bus is a
 privilege and not a right. Bus riders must adhere to all bus rules or
 will be removed from the bus. The privilege of riding the bus is
 conditional on proper behavior and observance of rules and
 regulations. Behavior on the school bus that is detrimental to
 health and safety may result in the privilege of riding the bus being
 denied.
- The bus driver reserves the right to remove a student from the bus for inappropriate behavior. Drivers are to contact parents with problems and may also report the student to school administration. The bus driver may complete a behavior referral for a student's behavior problems.
- Three referrals will result in a suspension from the bus. If a student receives a bus referral, they can be removed for a duration reflective of the offense. Multiple referrals can result in removal from the bus for the remainder of the school year.
- All school rules apply on the bus and at the bus stop. All disciplinary problems which develop on a school bus traveling to and from school will be handled by an administrator. A student can be removed or expelled from a bus if he or she is disrespectful to the driver, smokes, fights, curses, or causes any kind of disturbance on the bus which will endanger the safety and health of others. When a student is removed from the bus, the parent will assume the responsibility of getting the student to and from school.
